From the moment you enter the historic Fryemont Inn you will feel transported back in time to the warmth and friendly charm of a rustic Adirondack mountain lodge — in the heart of the Great Smoky Mountains.

The beautiful bark-covered hotel was built in 1923 by timber baron Amos Frye, and is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The Brown family — owners since 1982 — have lovingly preserved Frye's mountain getaway, maintaining the same rustic charm that's attracted guests to the mountain retreat for generations.



In the Fryemont's spacious lobby you'll find a huge stone fireplace, large enough to burn eight-foot logs — an ideal setting for mingling with old and new friends, playing games, watching the game in the TV corner, or just relaxing after a day in the outdoors.

The Lodge is a nostalgic trip back in time to the 1920s — high ceilings, chestnut paneling and no TVs or air conditioning. Large pocket windows slide away to let the cool mountain breezes in where ceiling fans circulate fresh air.



Each of the 37 cozy, chestnut paneled bedrooms and suites is unique with either a king, queen or a combination of bed sizes that may include twin beds. Some rooms connect as family suites. We'll help you choose the room that fits you or your family's needs.

All rooms and suites have private baths with either a tub, shower, or pedestal tub/shower. In the 1920s style, sink vanities are in the room.

The Fryemont also offers contemporary accommodations, which are open all year — in the Stone Cottage Suites, the Balcony Suites and the Log Cabin. And breakfast and dinner are included in the rates when the Historic Lodge is open, Mid-April through Thanksgiving



The Stone Cottage is just a short walk across the grounds from the Historic Lodge. Each of the Stone Cottage's four suites has central heat and air-conditioning, a spacious living room with fireplace and TV, and either a kitchen or a wet bar. All share the wide front porch with view of Bryson City and the Smokies.



The Balcony Suites are just a short stroll across the grounds from the Inn. Each of the four air conditioned suites has a private balcony with access from both the living room and bedroom. The living area has cable TV, dining table, and a wet bar with microwave, refrigerator and coffeemaker. The bedroom has a king-size bed, cable TV and a romantic fireplace with gas logs. The bath has a tub/shower.



The Log Cabin is located near the swimming pool making it a wonderful spot for families with children. The cabin has two queen bedrooms, 1-1/2 baths, central heat and air conditioning, an eat-in kitchen, cable TV with a DVD player and a wood stove fireplace. The front balcony has a beautiful view of the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, and is a perfect spot to grill burgers for lunch on the gas grill. Ideal for four, the cabin can accommodate up to six with the use of two roll-away beds.

A Bryson City dining tradition. And a favorite of tourists and locals alike, the Fryemont Inn's dining room is open to the public for both dinner and breakfast mid-April through Thanksgiving. If you're a lodging guest at the Fryemont, both daily meals are included in the price of your stay.

Breakfast includes the "Express" for folks on the go, as well as omelets, French toast, pancakes, biscuits and more.

All dinners include soup of the day, mixed green salad, entree of your choice, family style side dishes and dessert. You'll have a choice of five different fresh, local mountain trout entrees; as well as lamb shanks, prime rib, NY strip, sirloin, chicken dishes, Virginia ham and country ham. There's even a children's menu.



The full-service Fireside Bar opens for afternoon cocktails at five o'clock. A popular spot with visitors and locals alike, it's a great place to unwind after a day of outdoor activities, to meet friends, watch the game, play billiards, or order a snack or light dinner from the bar menu.

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
